

## **Taylors Beach Progress Association Inc. Family Fishing Tournament 2025 RULES**









1.	Enjoy the competition, but also be safe, courteous and obey all laws and rules.
1.	SLIP, SLOP, SLAP, SEEK and SLIDE.
2.	Do not start fishing without first registering and collecting your Tournament Token.
3.	All fishing and crabbing shall only to take place in Victoria Creek from the first red buoy at the mouth back upstream. No entry into the Marine Park Zone is allowed.
	The competition officially starts at 12.00 Noon on Friday 23 <sup>rd</sup> May, 2025, and finishes at 11:00am on Sunday 25 <sup>th</sup> May, 2025. You can fish at any
4.	time between start and finish.
-	Competitors must purchase tickets online and be registered prior to commencing any fishing. Registration takes place at Progress Park where
5.	each individual competitor will be issued with a 2025 Tournament Token. Tokens must be in hand when measuring fish or weighing crabs.
6.	Tokens to be presented by the holder to officials within 30 seconds of Lucky Token Draws or a redraw will occur.
7.	All members of the family may compete as part of the family team however any person who nominates, regardless of time spent or fish caught,
7.	will be included as part of the team.
8.	An adult is any competitor 16 years and over on the first day of the Tournament.
9.	Junior competitors must be under the age of 16 years on the first day of the Tournament.
10.	For the Family Catch category, the total accumulated lengths recorded at the measuring/weigh-in station, by a family team, will be divided by the
	number of adult anglers in the team to determine the winner.
	In the event of a draw for a prize, the fish or crab presented at the measuring/weigh-in station first will be deemed the winner. For a competitor
11.	using photos (catch and release) the time is recorded when the photo is presented at the measuring/weigh-in station to register their legal catch,
	and not when the photo is taken.
12.	Contestants may Fish and Crab as part of the contest.
13.	No pots may be placed in the water or set prior to 12.00 Noon on Friday 23rd May, 2025.
14.	No Lines are to be cast or set prior to12.00 Noon on Friday 23 <sup>rd</sup> May, 2025.
15	Any number of boats may be used per family. Boats may only depart the immediate vicinity of the Taylors Beach Boat Ramp after 12.00 Noon on
15.	Friday 23 <sup>rd</sup> May, 2025. Fish caught from a commercial fishing vessel or while commercial fishing are not accepted and competitors will be disqualified.
